

**ONEKAMA TOWNSHIP PARKS & RECREATION COMMITTEE
REGULAR MEETING THURSDAY, MAY 17, 2018, 8 A.M**

The meeting was called to order at 8 a.m. by Vice Chairman Mary Lou Millard.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Al Taylor, Rich Lapinski, Kevin Hughes, Paul Mueller, Mary Reed, Leann Burger, Millard.

MINUTES: Motion by Reed, second by Taylor to approve the minutes of the April 19, 2018 meeting as presented. Motion carried.

ONEKAMA DAYS: Taylor suggested contacting a person who paints rocks, as an entertainment activity for families who come to North Point Park for hot dogs and snacks on Saturday of Onekama Days. He will contact the lady and also contact Jim Mrozinski regarding the hot dogs and snacks.

PARK SIGNAGE: Reed reported the signs have been approved and are paid for. Cost was approximately \$6,448. She displayed a flyer on "10 Really Good Reasons You Should Care About Arbor Day" which she distributed at various places in the community in observance of Arbor Day.

GLEN PARK: Mueller received one bid so far to cut and move trees from the pathways in Glen Park.

KAYAK LAUNCH UPDATE: Taylor is awaiting the permit from the Army Corps of Engineers. Launch may be installed by the end of July.

ROAD ENDS: Lapinski distributed copies and photos he did of a thorough inspection of the township and road commission-owned road ends in the township, with detailed information on issues with various road ends. He was instructed to meet with Supervisor David Meister and Trustee James Wisniski to further discuss the report.

SCHOOL: Superintendent Hughes said the millage renewal passed. June 8 is the last day of school. Boilers were removed and will be replaced with high efficient boilers. Because of construction, there will be limited summer programs. On May 29, June 1 and June 2 the school will host a District Softball Tournament.

WATERSHED: Reed said the group is checking nine different sites for bacteria, and has contracted with District # 10 Health Department to do the work. The fund-raiser is July 28 at the home of Lee LaFleur.

PLA: Taylor reported the banners are up. The group is in charge of planting the petunias; this year they will be planted on Wednesday, May 23. The group's annual meeting for members only will be June 18 in the Village Park. The annual Block Party is July 5 from 5 to 9 p.m.

VILLAGE: Leann Burger reported for Village Council President Roger Burger: the washrooms in the park are being refurbished; the boat docks are in. The Onekama Garden Club and the village are working together to refurbish the park water fountain.
