1. Proposed amendments to the Portage Lake Overlay Zoning District – Discussion Only

Forth summarized the proposed changes to the ordinance language and noted the public hearing is tentatively scheduled for the August 8, 2023 meeting. Forth noted mixed-use development is not included at this time. The location and type of mixed-use buildings needs to be determined with more work by the Commission and further public input. Forth suggested a work session with a large-sale map that the Manistee County Planning Department can produce, but at a cost to the Village (app. \$125). The Commission also discussed current zoning issues and the need to move forward with the Master Plan update. Forth will follow-up with the Manistee County Planning Department to ensure the required notice is published in the local newspaper in accordance with State statute.

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> With regard to the Master Plan, the Commission discussed the Manistee County Community Foundation decision not to provide funding and steps to move the project forward. Halloran suggested the Village finance the amount requested from the Foundation. Forth indicated the Request for Proposals can be updated and distributed again in November 2023 with a project start in the spring of 2024.
