REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES June 17, 2020

Call to Order: President Franz called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: was led by President Franz

-COMMITTEE REPORTS

ZONING:

--Zoning Administrator, Mike Szokola reported looking into a height violation of a fence on 4th street and drainage problem resulting from bringing in large quantity of fill which is impacting a neighbors' lot. Much discussion followed. Since they are in violation, they could ask for a variance but this takes time and another problem to consider do they take down fence while they are seeking the variance? It was also brought up that the Planning Commission has been working on revisions to the fence ordinance which may help in this case .More discussion. Trustee Schwing moved, Trustee Arthur supported to allow the fence to stay up until the fence issue is resolved by the PC. Roll Call: Schwing/yes, Burger/yes, Hudson/no, Arthue/yes, Drumm/yes, Miller/abstains and Franz/yes.M.C.

The ZA also reported being contacted by the Blue Slipper regarding additional outside seating enclosed with a fence and from the Glenwood, extension of their handi-cap ramp. Lots of discussion. The Treasurer inquired about the status of canvas tent structure on Main St which has been violation since the early fall of 2019. She was told this is being addressed.

PLANNING COMMISSION

SEWER

--Lift Station 3 Engineering Agreement/Fleis and Vandenbrink

This was talked about in detail in the February minutes. Trustee Burger moved, Trustee Miller supported to authorize President Franz to sign this agreement. M.C.

--Saw Grant Letter of Engagement with Baker Tilly

This firm will be doing an in depth study of the sewer rates. Trustee Burger moved, Trustee Drumm supported to authorize President Franz to sign letter. M.C.

--Saw Grant Approve Purchase Order with Leica Geosystems for GPS equipment

This would be for hardware and software with regard to our sewer system. Trustee Burger moved, Trustee Miller supported to authorize President Franz to sign. M.C.

--Purchase Order with Consumers Power to upgrade service to LS#3

This will be for a 3 phase power supply. Trustee Burger moved, Trustee Schwing supported to authorize President Franz to sign. M.C.

--Request by the Manistee County Planning Dept. for the Village to provide electronic data of the sewer system for use primarily by the Zoning Administrator.

This was discussed with the Village Attorney and he saw no (legal) problem with this action.

Trustee Burger moved and Trustee Schwing supported to approve the data transfer.

Trustee Burger also reported that the wet wells were cleaned out and a pipeline cleaning company had to be called in to extract a large amount not biodegradable rags, from the system. It was discussed to send out a letter with the taxes regarding this issue.

President Franz asked Trustee Burger to make contact again with the residents that are still in violation with regard to the smoke testing.

STREETS:

President Franz had an inquiry with regard to property behind hardware store being land locked. Village Attorney was contacted and found this not to be the case. It's not land locked.
