		Kevin said prom for next year will be later in the year. Julie and Kevin met with Portage Point Inn / Jamil about Friday, May 29, 2020. Same price, if we hit target number of people. We can also bring in cupcakes, Deb has volunteered. We need to let him know soon to secure that date. Break-even point would be 75 people on rental space.
