

ORDINANCE #1 61-1 H.M.

**POLLUTION REGULATION OF ONEKAMA TOWNSHIP
MANISTEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN.**

By virtue of the power vested in the Board of Health for Onekama Township, Manistee County, Michigan, under Revised Statutes, State of Michigan of 1846, Chapter 35, as amended, being Section 14.61 et al., Michigan Statutes Annotated, as amended, the Board of Health of Onekama Township has given approval for the passage of the following regulations in order to regulate the problem of pollution of lakes and streams, and water courses, and public and private premises located in said Township of Onekama and to provide penalties for the violation of such regulations within the Township of Onekama, Manistee County, Michigan.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to dispose of or cause to be disposed any industrial waste, garbage, untreated sewage, refuse, ashes, cherries, cherry pits, oil fruits, fruit juice, animal substances, vegetable substances, shavings, sawdust, milk plant wastes or other waste material into a lake, stream, open ditch, county drain or any water course in the Township of Onekama, Manistee county, Michigan, and it shall also be unlawful to dispose of any of the foregoing materials and substances on the ground surface within two hundred (200) yards of a public road, public pard, public premise or private premise.

Section 2. It is further provided that nothing herein shall relieve any person, firm or corporation from complying with County or State Law in regards to pollution of any lake, stream, open ditch, county drain or any water course or public or private premises.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars or imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

EFFECTIVE DATE.

The provisions of this regulation are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the health, welfare and safety of the public, and it is hereby ordered to take immediate effect and be enforced from and after the date hereof and it is ordered that said regulation be published in the manner described by law.
