## **ORDINANCE NO. 34**

## VILLAGE OF ONEKAMA MANISTEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

## AN ORDIANCE TO PROHIBIT THE OPEN BURNING OF GARBAGE, RUBBISH, DEBRIS AND OTHER MATERIALS; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES THEREFORE; AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH

The Village of Onekama Ordains:

- Section 1. <u>Definitions.</u> The following terms used in this ordinance have the meanings hereafter ascribed to them:
  - a. "Person" means any natural person, firm, association, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, limited liability partnership, or similar legal entity or any combination of them, but does not include the Village or any other governmental agency or municipal corporation located or acting within the Village.
  - b. "Village" shall mean the Village of Onekama.
- Section 2. Prohibited Acts. No person shall burn, or cause to be burned, outside of any dwelling or structure on private property or in any public street, alley, highway, park or other public place, any leaves, lawn clippings, brush, stumps, wood, or other similar matter, rubbish, solid waste materials, building materials, junk, refuse, garbage, or any other miscellaneous debris capable of being burned.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Exception.</u> This ordinance shall not be construed to limit or prohibit barbecues, cooking fires or other similar fires suitably contained on private property or in established stoves or fixtures on public property.
- Section 4. Penalty. Any person who violates this ordinance shall be guilty of a municipal civil infraction under Ordinance No. 30 of the Village, being the Village of Onekama Municipal Ordinance Violations Bureau Ordinance.
- Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the twenty first (21) say following its publication as required by law.
- Section 6. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
